Discipline: B1.B.6 "Development Economics"

Annotation

The program of the course "Economics of Development" is intended for study by fourth-year undergraduate students of the Institute of Economics and Business with a degree in Economics. The course is designed for 144 academic hours, of which 72 are classroom (36 hours of lectures and 36 hours of seminars) and as well as independent work of students with subsequent control - 72 hours.

The lectures are supposed to describe the models of the formation of a market economy from the point of view of the main currents of economic thought, carry out an in-depth analysis of the role and significance of the degree of development of factor markets in the problem of income distribution and poverty, a description of the political and economic approach to the problem of development, a critical analysis of the experience of individual countries in the formation of and modernization of the market economy, identifying the problems of the Russian Federation and the Republic of Armenia in the context of the development economy. Within the framework of the seminars, work with students is planned, aimed at a detailed explanation of the most difficult problems of the course. In the course of classes, students master and consolidate basic concepts in the main literature, as well as on topics of interest to them - in additional.

In the process of studying the course, 4 credits are expected to be awarded. Students are also provided with assistance in independent study of the material, additional explanations of the most difficult issues are provided on an individual basis.

The independent work of students includes mastering a part of the material intended for independent study, doing homework in the process of preparing for a test, and presenting a presentation on the development experience of a particular country.

At the end of the course, students are expected to hold a test, in which students demonstrate knowledge of the main provisions and theories of development economics set out during the lectures.

The purpose of the discipline: Providing a comprehensive understanding of the differences in the socio-economic development of different countries of the world, both from a theoretical and practical point of view.

Discipline objectives: Familiarization with the history and modern approaches to ensuring economic growth and economic development and assessing the possibilities of their application to the conditions of Russia and Armenia.
