6 ECTS, 216 academic hours.

Summary. The main purpose of the course in the non-language faculty of the university is the teaching of practical knowledge of colloquial speech and language specialties for the active use of a foreign language, both in everyday life and in professional communication.

The criterion of practical knowledge of a foreign language is the ability to confidently use the most commonly used and relatively simple language means in the main types of speech activity: communication, listening comprehension (listening), reading and writing. In speech, it is permissible to have errors that are not distort meaning and do not interfere with understanding. Practical language skills specialty also presupposes the ability to independently work with a special literature in a foreign language in order to obtain professional information.

Learning task: the basis for building the program is to divide the course into two directions or aspects - "general language" (General Language) and "language for special purposes" (Language for Specific Purposes - LSP), - each of which is allocated 50% of the educational time at all stages of training. They differ from each other by subject matter and lexical the composition of educational texts, the priority of a particular type of speech activity, the development skills necessary to master the appropriate register of speech. Both directions are interconnected in the educational process by the presence of common grammatical topics and the need to master similar syntactic phenomena and basic speech skills.

In the aspect "Common language" the following is carried out: development of the skills of perception of sounding speech (monologue and dialogue), development of oral conversational and everyday speech skills, development of skills reading and writing. Teaching a common language is carried out on the material of works of speech non-specialized (everyday and general cognitive) topics, as well as regional and a culturological nature.
