Abstract: In the context of the formation of the rule of law and the integration of Armenia and Russia into the world economy, the development of market relations and entrepreneurship in our country, the issues of formation, development and consolidation of a new legal thinking, problems of forming an effective market economy, issues of general legal culture, etc.

In this regard, future specialists in the field of economics need not only get acquainted with the basic general theoretical principles and categories of the state and law, but also to determine the value of the knowledge gained for subsequent practical activities. Therefore, this program focuses students not only on acquaintance with basic knowledge about state and legal phenomena, but also gives an opportunity correlate the knowledge gained with those economic and political changes, which have been taking place in our country lately.

Academic task: As a result of studying the discipline, the student must:

- know the basic general theoretical principles and categories of state and law and their correlation with economic categories; main sources of Armenian and Russian law governing public relations in the field of economics and entrepreneurial activity; legal forms of state regulation of the economy; organizational and legal forms of entrepreneurship;
