Summary

The author's seminar «Economic Policy vs Political Economics» is devoted to identifying the role of political economics, both in economics and in political science, as well as in the economic policy of the state. Political economics analyzes the impact of political forces on the economy, assesses the impact of the economy on politics, and uses the tools of economics to study politics. This happens because voters and certain groups of political interests affect the effectiveness of almost any implemented economic policy, and, on the other hand, everything that happens in the economy at the macro level and at the international level can both strengthen and weaken the positions of those forces that are in power.

The purpose and objectives of the discipline

- Know: the problems of world and local political and economic relations, the political strategy and practice of various countries, international economic organizations and associations, including the Republic of Armenia.
